

ANALYSIS – Sept 1st to Mar 31st

- WEBSITE: 49,758 page views with most activity from early Jan to late Feb. The Front Page and Trail Conditions were the most popular pages.
- SOCIAL MEDIA: Increased followers on both Twitter and Facebook by over 100 on each channel. Posts with photos were by far the most popular, especially those related to grooming.
 - TWITTER: By far the most active in Jan (41.1K tweet impressions)
 - FACEBOOK: Activity peaked in mid-Feb. Busiest day was January 20th where we reached over 3000 people thanks to two popular posts about grooming.

- •Hosted and sponsored 2 ski nights socials with approximately 65 attendees in total.







Teen Skate Coordinator Report: Heather Boswell (1 of 2)

- Non-competitive skate-only program for ages 11-17
- Due to varying skill level and speed of students, we created two streams:
 - Teen Skate 1 beginners and progression from JR4 – 11students, Saturday
 - Teen Skate 2 intermediate/ advanced – 7 students, Sunday
- Optional Thursday evening ski







Teen Skate Coordinator Report: Heather Boswell (2 of 2)

- Started in October with Saturday hikes in surrounding parks and nature preserves very well attended, all parents and some siblings too.
- We were on snow in December with lots of technique training at the field at 401 Corkstown.
- Two TS2 classes were cancelled due to weather. We skied into April, adding several field trips to Gatineau Park which were very well attended.
- New this year we created Report Cards for the two classes.









Masters Coordinator Report: Mike Duivenvoorden

- •Two new leaders and two returning added the depth needed for a successful program
- •The Program consisted of the following:

 - 10 week Novice (classic), and 10 week Intermediate (Skate) •5 week Novice (classic, and 5 week Intermediate (Skate) - starting in January only
 - •7 drop-in sessions on specific techniques
 - Advanced Adult Fitness Drop-In
 - •Adult Touring
- •Nominally 70 participants (55 in regular programs, 15 drop-in and semi-private)
- Looking Ahead:
 - •Maintain 10 week programs (possible reduce to 9 weeks per participant feedback) Convert 5 week novice to Adult Novice Skate

 - •Convert 5 week intermediate to Adult Intermediate Classic
 - Could add more capacity with an additional qualified leader

Background

- grooming seasons.
- reliability, and amount of volunteer maintenance labour.
- equipment, such as the Mogul Master groomer, and offseason trail maintenance needs.
- the context of expected operating costs and other capital purchases, we can determine whether fees have to be adjusted.
- grooming use by Kanata Nordic with the inevitable breakdowns will likely see the value descend to zero.
- machine every three years on average.
- heavy grooming needs like snow events when we have multiple groomers operating at once.



• The outgoing snow-machine, a 2011 SkiDoo Skandic SWT V-800, was purchased in 2010 and has served Kanata Nordic for nine full

• The 2011 Skandic was purchased while the club was located at Riverfront Park, with mostly flat terrain and significantly less trail length. • The 2011 Skandic has been at the end of its lifecycle for the past two grooming seasons, suffering several major breakdowns requiring significant expense to repair. This season it has become an unreliable unit and not suitable to groom next season due to repair costs,

• As our club evolves our snow-machine needs are also evolving, requiring a more powerful unit to handle the terrain needs, and heavier

• Kanata Nordic has the funds to cover the proposed purchase amount. In addition, after year-end financials are available, and we analyze in

• The 2011 Skandic is currently running, and will be either traded in for credit at the time of purchase of a new unit, or sold with the proceeds returning to the club. (Current value not known at this time.) It can have value to a residential owner for light-duty use. Additional

• Current plan for club is to maintain three snow-machines with a nine-year replacement cycle per machine. That means a new snow-

• Three snow-machines are needed due to having two separate sites, with redundancy due to maintenance/breakdown issues, and during
